Subject: Toledo Police Department 2022 Annual Report

This annual report is designed to provide transparency into the activities and accomplishments of the Toledo Police Department. Additionally, an analysis of statistics of calls for services and types of investigations into criminal activity are also part of this report. We hope this report serves as an opportunity for the public and governing body to gain greater insight into department functions as well as the types of calls your police department handles.

Staffing

Currently, the Toledo Police Department consists of 5 certified peace officers, 1 peace officer attending the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy and 3 reserve peace officers.

Dan Quigley is the Chief of Police for the Toledo Police Department (TPD). Chief Quigley is a 2001 graduate of South Tama County High School and is a graduate of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy 228th Basic class. He has been a member of the Toledo Police Department since March of 2012.

During the course of 2022 TPD saw staffing changes to include:

- The resignation of Shannon Bowers as Reserve Police Officer.
- The resignation of Nathan Shepard as Chief of Police.
- The appointment of Dan Quigley as Chief of Police.
- Appointment of Dalaynee Henle as Reserve Police Officer.

Nuisance Abatement Process

One of the responsibilities of the Toledo Police Department is to address nuisance properties. In 2022 call records show 100 calls for service relating to nuisance abatements. Twenty-one (21) properties were served notices regarding “junk” or “junk vehicles”. Numerous others were served notices regarding tall grass/noxious weeds and snow/ice accumulation on sidewalks. These properties had varying levels of compliance. ***Dangerous buildings were addressed through the City Attorney’s office.*

The Toledo Police Department will continue to work with our community and property owners to address nuisance abatement violations to improve the appearance and safety for the community. Voluntary compliance will always be preferred over city enforcement remediation and sanctions

Calls For Service (CFS) and Cases

The Toledo Police Department responds to calls for service within the City of Toledo as well as providing mutual aid for other law enforcement agencies such as the Tama Police Department, Tama County Sheriff’s Office, Meskwaki Nation Police Department (in certain situations), Iowa State Patrol, Iowa Department of Corrections and other state and federal law enforcement agencies.

A call for service is the most basic activity of the police department. These may include checking a business, on a disabled motorist, suspicious activity or returning a phone call to someone in need of assistance. In some cases, these calls require further action to include follow up, more

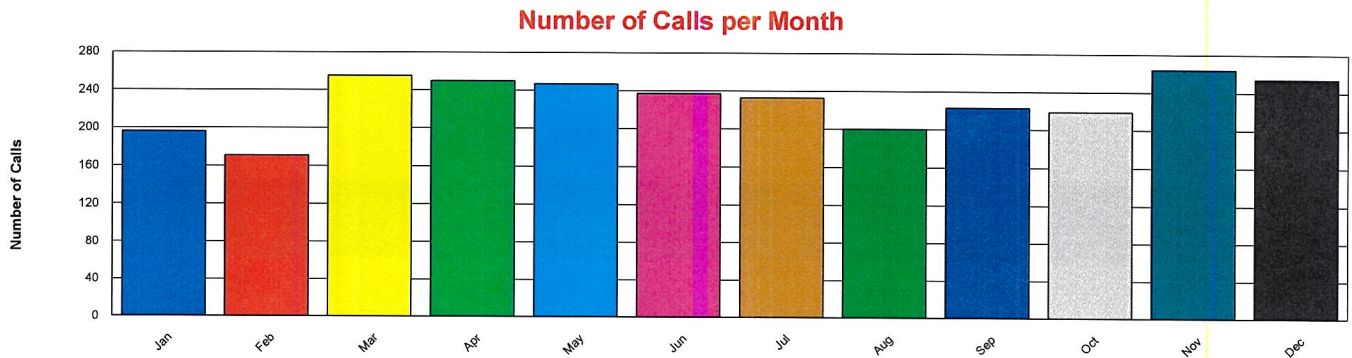
in depth investigation which may lead to an arrest. This then creates a “case” from this call for service.

The Toledo Police Department engages our community in many ways to include but not limited to business checks, traffic enforcement, consensual encounters with those walking and driving throughout our community. Additionally, we go to a variety of community events (which will be discussed later).

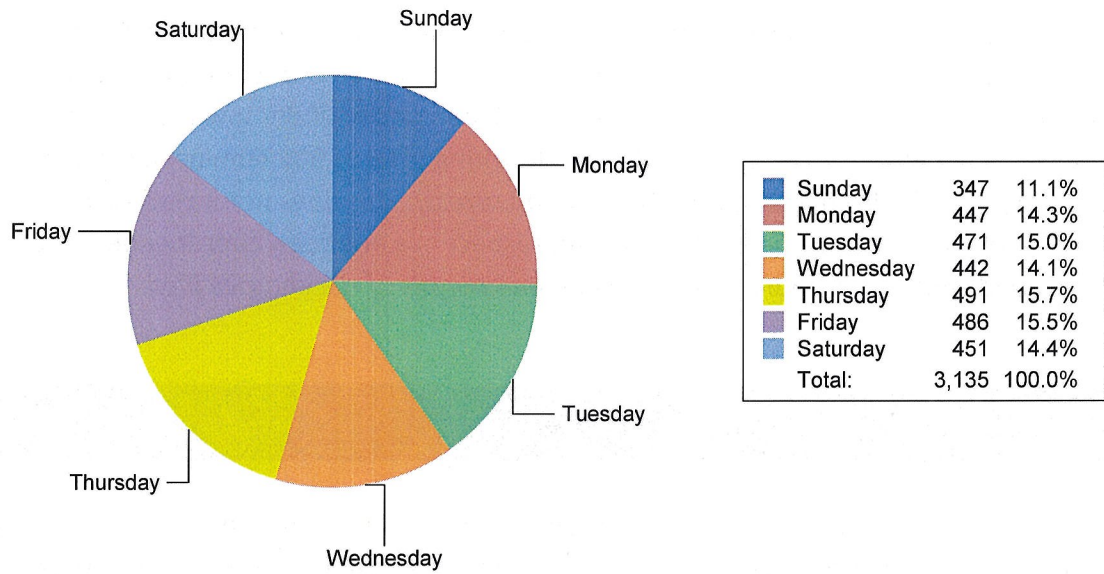
Toledo residents should know that Toledo continues to be a quiet, peaceful community. Events and incidents which occur in communities across the state and country also occur here. However, just less frequently and on a smaller scale. Arrests are made each year for drug violations, domestic assaults, impaired driving, sexual assaults and other criminal acts.

In 2022 Toledo Police Department responded to 3,238 calls for service. Examples of calls made include but not limited to: thefts, burglaries, traffic complaints, building checks, motor vehicle accidents, harassment, animal complaints, parking complaints and more.

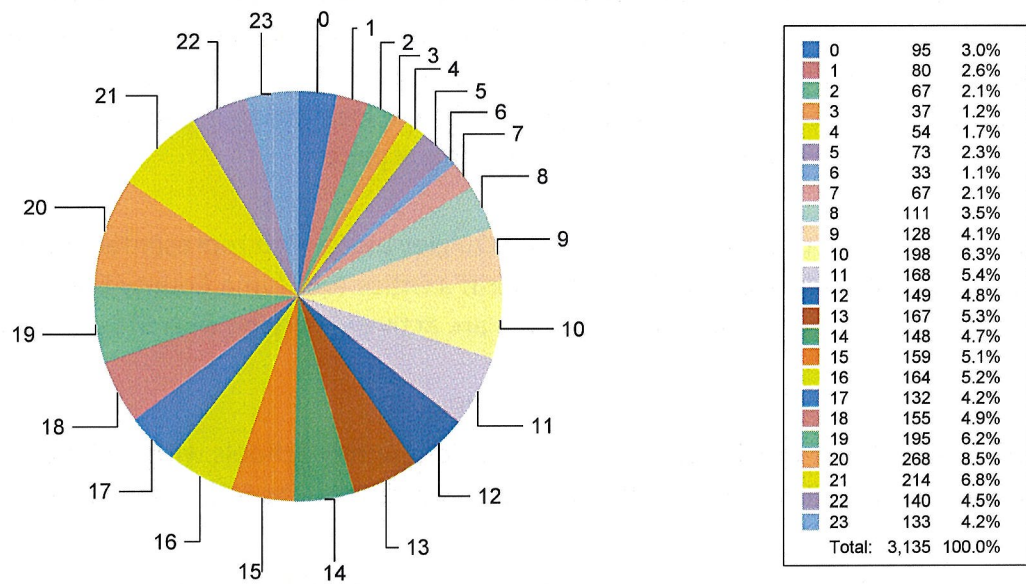

Arrests

There are times when at the conclusion of an investigation ends in an arrest. Officers have discretion in many instances when to arrest, when to issue a court summons, or issue a citation or warning. There are other times when arrests are mandatory under Iowa law. During 2022 the Toledo Police Department effected 282 arrests with a total of 902 criminal charges filed (*it is common for multiple charges to be filed with an arrest*). This does not include applications for arrest warrants that have been filed, but the suspect has not been apprehended as of yet.

Community Involvement

Community presence is a vital part of the job of a law enforcement officers. Not every contact is about enforcement of laws and ordinances. Building relationships is just as important. We are part of this community as well. We take pride in it. As previously mentioned, many of our personnel are proud STC graduates. This gives us more reason to be involved and desire to keep this community safe.

The members of the Toledo Police Department get involved in the community in a variety of ways. Whether it is volunteering for the local volunteer Fire Department or EMS Service or being a member of a local organization (i.e. Masonic Lodge, Kiwanis, etc). Toledo Police Officers have also enjoyed breakfast with residents of Birkwood Village, enjoyed a beverage or snack at youth lemonade stands, escorted Iowa/Iowa State football run, traffic control and presence for "The Wall That Heals" exhibit, guest speaking for Kiwanis, Toledo Library or local at home day cares, attending the National Night Out with other area law enforcement agencies and the local Fraternal Order of Eagles, and playing baseball with local youth in the courthouse square. Many of these can be seen on our department Facebook page.

The new STC Superintendent invited Chief Quigley along with representatives from Tama Police, Meskwaki Nation Police, Tama County Sheriff's Office and Tama County EMA to take part in a safety audit of all STC school buildings. We are actively working with STC on safety assessment project.

Additionally, Chief Quigley assisted with STC Community Schools with their vulnerability assessment and sits on the Safety Committee which includes STC staff and citizens.

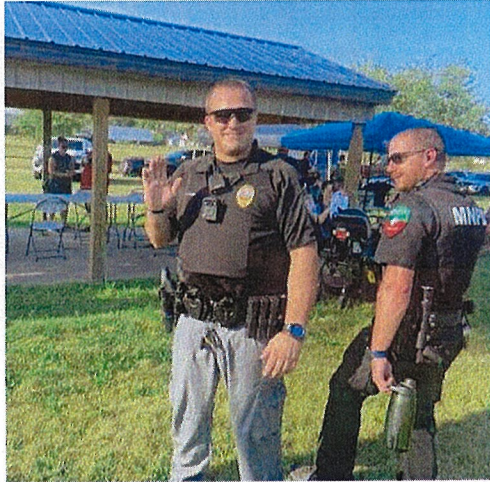

Santa Clause at our designated mailbox. Seeing the kid's enjoyment as they take part in this has always been a highlight.

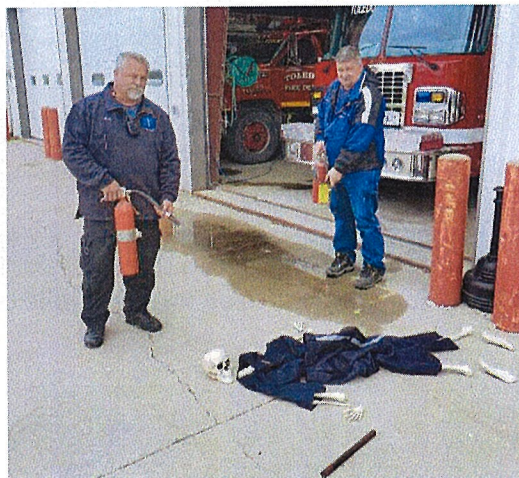

Miscellaneous Items of note

Other highlights of 2022 include but not limited to:

- Lt. Wunn took the evidence room project head on. He spent dozens of hours researching, making policy, organizing, filing destruction orders, etc.
- Sgt. Howe was recognized by the Governors Traffic Safety Bureau for his efforts in impaired driving enforcement.
- Kwik Star and Coca-Cola Atlantic Bottling Company each donated \$1,000 to the Toledo Police Department. These funds were used to purchase breaching equipment that the department lacked prior. Now all patrol vehicles are equipped with a Universal Breaching Tool. One ram was purchased to be utilized until others can be ordered to equip other two patrol vehicles.

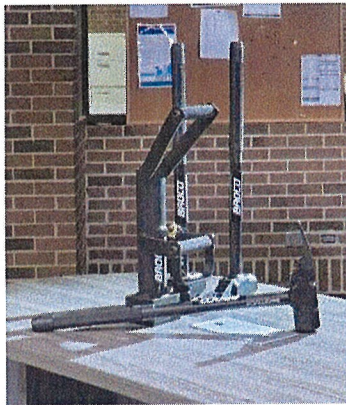

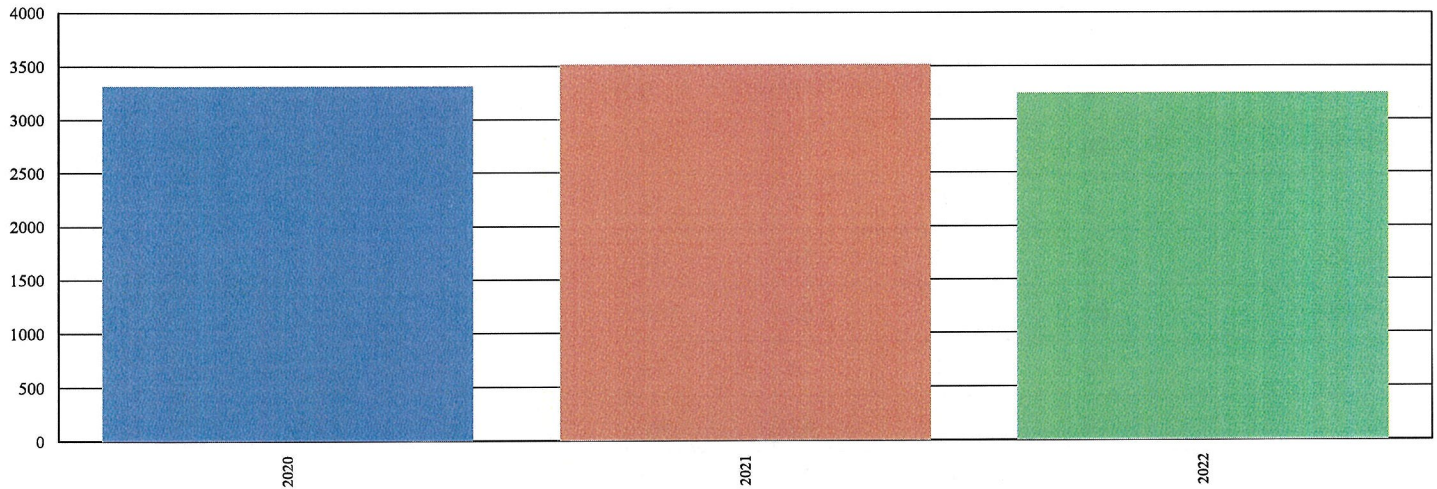

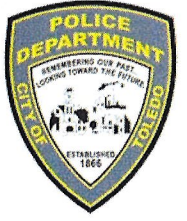
