### **Subject: Toledo Police Department 2023 Annual Report**

This annual report is designed to provide transparency into the activities and accomplishments of the Toledo Police Department. Additionally, an analysis of statistics of calls for services and types of investigations into criminal activity are also part of this report. We hope this report serves as an opportunity for the public and governing body to gain greater insight into department functions as well as the types of calls your police department handles.

## Staffing

At full strength the Toledo Police Department consists of 7 certified peace officers and 3 reserve peace officers. As of the authoring of this document two patrol officer positions are still vacant.

Dan Quigley is the Chief of Police for the Toledo Police Department (TPD). Chief Quigley is a 2001 graduate of South Tama County High School and is a graduate of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy 228<sup>th</sup> Basic class. He has been a member of the Toledo Police Department since March of 2012.

During the course of 2023 TPD saw staffing changes to include:

- Resignation of Sgt. Kyle Howe.
- The hiring of Vern Jefferson as Police Officer with special assignment as School Resource Officer with the South Tama County Community School District.
- Resignation of Officer Cole Savage.

During the course of the 2023 calendar year, Officer Ryan completed his probationary period with the Police Department.

Reserve Officer Henle completed the ILEA Reserve Peace Officer certification requirements.

## Education and Training

Training is an important and valuable asset to law enforcement. In 2023 various trainings were completed. Below is a highlight of some of those trainings.

Officer Nick Ryan received his Iowa Peace Officer Certification upon graduation of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy's 307<sup>th</sup> Basic class. Additionally, he successfully completed a 12-week Field Training Program.

Officers completed training in a variety of areas to include:

- Stop stick certification
- De-escalation/Use of force
- Behavioral health
- Bloodborne pathogens
- Hazardous Materials
- Taser certification
- Firearms qualifications
- Mandatory reporter recertification (Child abuse/Dependent adult)

Chief Quigley and Lt. Wunn attended an annual Small Agency Administration conference and networked with other administrators from small police agencies. Some topics discussed included: Working major cases, DCI lab- Packaging, Preserving & Delivering, Benefits of a Mental Health Liaison, Starting & Managing a Reserve Program, creating safer cities through technology, UCR reporting, Duty to Supervise and Train and an ILEA update.

Additionally Chief Quigley and Lt. Wunn have begun leadership training provided through a partnership with Lexipol and Echelon Front. Lexipol is our partner in maintaining departmental policies.

SRO Jefferson completed a 40 hour Basic School Resource Officer certification through the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO).

### Nuisance Abatement Process

One of the responsibilities of the Toledo Police Department is to address nuisance properties. In 2023 call records show 58 calls for service relating to nuisance abatements. Fourteen (14) properties were served notices regarding "junk" or "junk vehicles". Numerous others were served notices regarding tall grass/noxious weeds and snow/ice accumulation on sidewalks. These properties had varying levels of compliance. *\*\*Dangerous buildings are addressed through the City Attorney's office.*

The Toledo Police Department will continue to work with our community and property owners to address nuisance abatement violations to improve the appearance and safety for the community. Voluntary compliance will always be preferred over city enforcement remediation and sanctions

### Calls For Service (CFS) and Cases

The Toledo Police Department responds to calls for service within the City of Toledo as well as providing mutual aid for other law enforcement agencies such as the Tama Police Department, Tama County Sheriff's Office, Meskwaki Nation Police Department (in certain situations), Iowa

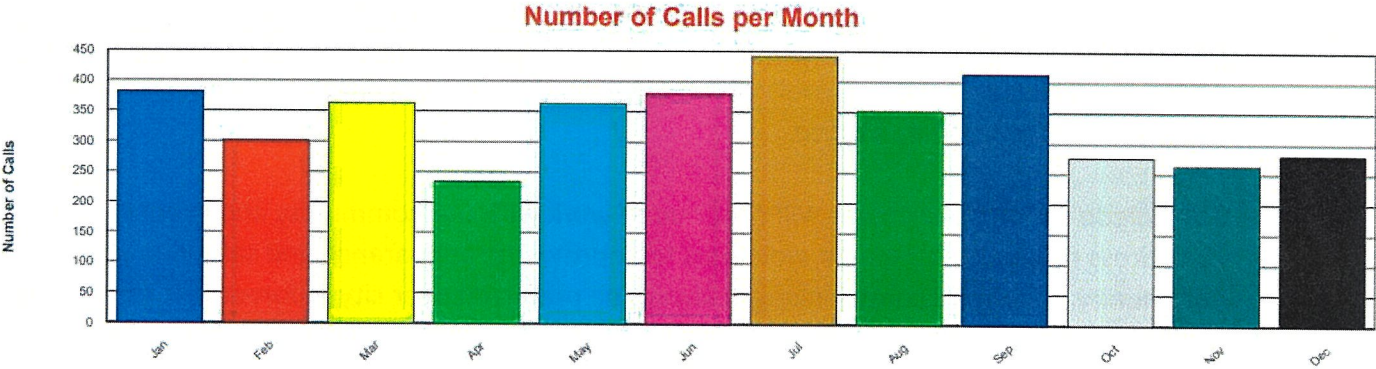
State Patrol, Iowa Department of Corrections and other state and federal law enforcement agencies.

A call for service is the most basic activity of the police department. In 2023 Toledo Police Department responded to **4,048** calls for service. Calls for service may be initiated by a caller, or may be a result of proactivity by an Officer. Examples of calls made include but not limited to: thefts, burglaries, traffic complaints, traffic stops, building checks, motor vehicle accidents, harassment, animal complaints, parking complaints and more. Below and on the next page you will find graphs of call number breakdowns by month, day and hour. In the back of this packet, you will find a breakdown of the call types officers responded to in 2023. As well as comparisons over the last 3 years.

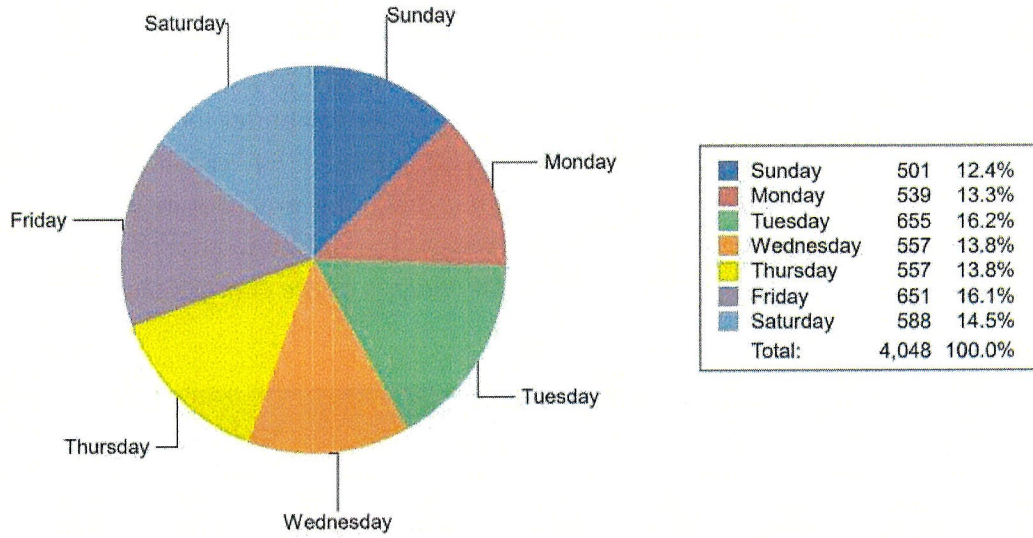
In some cases, these calls require further action to include follow up, more in depth investigation which may lead to an arrest. This then creates a “case” from this call for service. In 2023, Toledo Police initiated **386** cases.

Toledo residents should know that Toledo continues to be a quiet, peaceful community. Events and incidents which occur in communities across the state and country also occur here. However, just less frequently and on a smaller scale. Arrests are made each year for drug violations, domestic assaults, impaired driving, sexual assaults and other criminal acts.

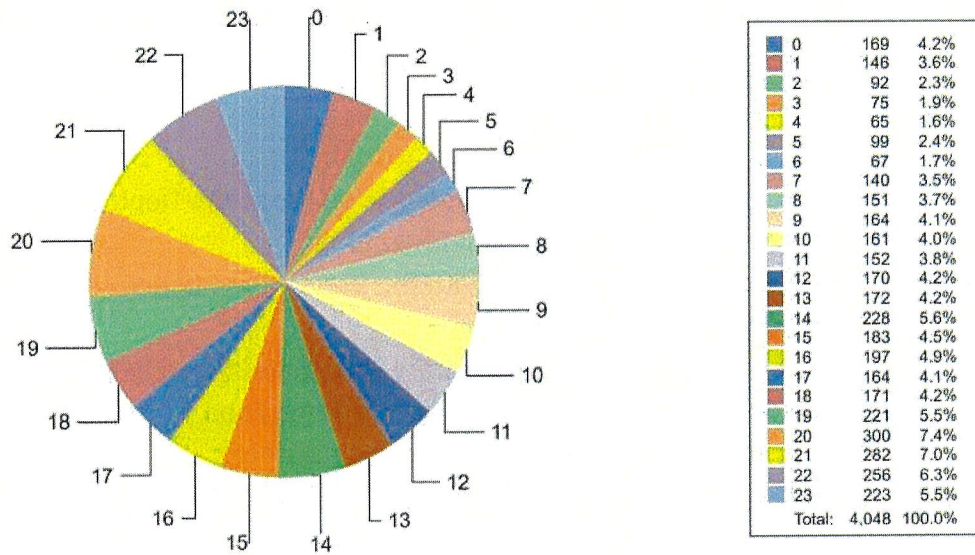
TPD has seen a growth in reports of thefts, burglaries, fraud and domestic disputes. Impaired driving and narcotic violations remain a priority for our agency. In 2023 Officers came in contact with individuals possessing heroin, which was unsettling to us. Toledo is not immune from opiate possession and opiate addiction.

## Arrests

There are times when at the conclusion of an investigation ends in an arrest. Officers have discretion in many instances when to arrest, when to issue a court summons, or issue a citation or warning. There are other times when arrests are mandatory under Iowa law. During 2023 the Toledo Police Department effected **242** arrests with a total of **547** criminal charges filed (*it is common for multiple charges to be filed with an arrest*). This does not include applications for arrest warrants that have been filed, but the suspect has not been apprehended as of yet. *\*\*Attached with this document, you will find an analysis of the charges filed.*

## Community Involvement

Community presence is a vital part of the job of a law enforcement officer. Not every contact is about enforcement of laws and ordinances. Building relationships is just as important. We are part of this community as well. We take pride in it. As previously mentioned, many of our personnel are proud STC graduates. This gives us more reason to be involved and desire to keep this community safe.

The members of the Toledo Police Department get involved in the community in a variety of ways. Below you will find a list of some of the ways members of TPD volunteer with the community. This is not an inclusive list:

- 2 TPD Officers are members of the Toledo Volunteer Fire Dept.
- 1 Officer is a member of Toledo Volunteer EMS
- 3 TPD Officers volunteer to coach with the STC School District.

- SRO Jefferson organized a food drive for the Tama Food Pantry. This event brought in 572 food items, \$130 in cash and a \$10 gift certificate.
- TPD partnered with other area first responders and the Fraternal Order of Eagles for National Night out.
- 4 TPD Officers took part in "Trunk or Treat" in the Courthouse square
- 3 TPD Officers took part in the "Santa coming to town" at the Tama Fire Station
- 4 Officers attended "Supper with Super Heroes" sponsored by Tama County SKIP
- Provided presentations about various topics to local civic groups.
- SRO Jefferson organized a "Toys for Tots" toy drive.
- 2 Officers are members of the local Masonic Lodge

## Achievements and other miscellaneous items of note

Other highlights of 2023 include but not limited to:

- The implantation of a School Resource Officer (SRO) in partnership with the South Tama County Community School District and the cities of Toledo and Tama. The Toledo Police Department being the employing agency of the SRO.
- Toledo Police received the following grants/donations
  - Mansfield Grant to assist with wages for SRO Jefferson in the amount of \$50,000 a year for 5 years
  - American Brawn awarded TPD \$1,500 to assist with the cost of replacement ballistic vests
  - Tama-Toledo Chamber of Commerce donated \$2,000 from RAGBRAI profits
  - Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau awarded TPD with \$15,000 in Overtime reimbursement for traffic enforcement.
  - Tama County Community Foundation awarded TPD with a grant to purchase Individual First Aid Kits (IFAK's) for personnel and extra tourniquets.
  - Through the schools, the State of Iowa provided a 4<sup>th</sup> AED to be issued to SRO Jefferson.
- TPD along with other law enforcement and first responders provided traffic control, security, first aid and during RAGBRAI.
- An updated policy manual continues to be reviewed and implemented.
- A 2023 Chevrolet Tahoe was added to the vehicle fleet

- An upgrade in body and in car cameras to Motorola/Watchguard, giving us better quality video and storage abilities.
- Upgrade in Taser CEWs. The past models had become outdated and being used past warranty and shelf life. Fulltime staff were issued Taser 7's while the better of the previous model X2s were kept for Reserve Officers.

## Closing remarks

2023 has been a stressful year for the Toledo Police Department. As a result of an incident which garnered media attention, members of this department as well as other city employees have endured harassment to include name calling, belittling, and even death threats. TPD shut down social media for this reason. A final decision has not been made whether to reimplement that page or not.

Since July of 2022 the Toledo Police Department has been short staffed and not operating at full strength since. We are currently two patrol positions short. Despite these issues in addition to stressors in their personal lives, the Officers of the Toledo Police Department have been resolute in their mission to provide fair and impartial law enforcement and service to the city of Toledo. I am proud of the members of the Toledo Police Department.

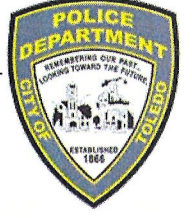

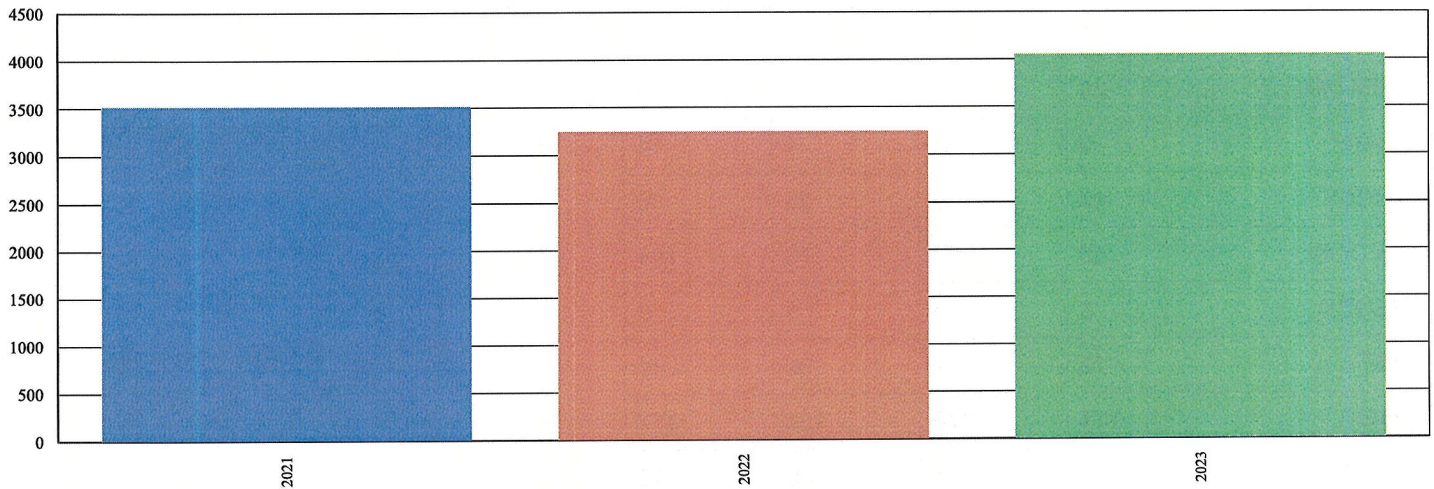

**Count of Calls per Year**



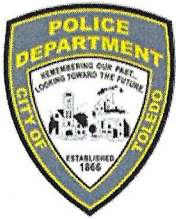
